From the Church-side

- 1. Northeast Find a Project Webpage
 - i. Communicate with your nonprofit concerning serve opportunities:
 - 1. For individuals and community groups
 - 2. Ongoing needs as well as one-time serve needs
 - ii. Report these back to Madison, who will put them on the Find a Project webpage
- 2. Northeast Story Portal
 - i. See the Story Portal page in the Northeast Processes/Systems section
- 3. Northeast Groups
 - i. This includes men's and women's mentoring groups, community/small groups, and so on
 - ii. Local Outreach is working with the Spiritual Formation team to engage community/small group leaders with serve opportunities, for their groups
 - iii. Ideally, it would be fantastic if each Northeast group would adopt a nonprofit or school and make a one-year commitment to that organization.
 - iv. Types of projects:
 - 1. Projects that can accommodate multiple people, possibly including kids/teens.
 - 2. Drives (see next page)
- 4. Ministry Fair
 - i. During Shalom series Sunday, Dec. 18th
- 5. Fundraiser
 - i. One-time a year
 - ii. We won't advertise fundraising dinner/breakfast type venues
 - iii. Must be physical where the family can join in...like a concert, golf scramble, run/bike ride, etc.
- 6. Physical presence in the atrium like a Love the "Ville station
 - i. Have requested and am waiting

From the Personal side

- 1. Invite others to serve in your ministry! (See the Volunteer Recruitment training)
 - a. 20 years of vocational ministry experience has shown me that those who invite, shoulder-tap, etc. are far more successful than those who rely on the above "church-side" techniques.
